New York State Education Department (NYSED) Regionalization Plans are a source of concern for the Port Jefferson School District Board of Education as we believe that NYSED's plan has the potential to negatively impact the community. We recognize the need to explore new strategies to ensure equitable access to high-quality education across the state, however, we believe that unintended, negative consequences could be caused by regionalization as a broad policy initiative. In response, the Port Jefferson School District Board of Education has signed on with the Coalition of School Board Members (COSBM) and thirty other Boards of Education to express our strong opposition to the emergency rule recently implemented by NYSED regarding this issue. Additionally, we support the Nassau- Suffolk School Boards Association position statement on the topic seeking additional stakeholder feedback to promote a collaborative decision making process.

What is the Regionalization Plan?

Regionalization is a state-mandated approach that would require school districts to discuss consolidating services and resource-sharing with their BOCES component districts, without an option to participate or not. This plan could lead to decisions affecting Port Jefferson without input from those who matter most—our community members.

Our primary concerns include:

- Loss of autonomy of local school districts and their Boards of Education.
- Mandates for accepting and sharing resources, as well as students, from other districts, which could impact our classroom resources.
- Lack of transparency regarding the financial and governance implications.

We believe it is essential to keep control over our schools within our community to preserve the high standards and quality education that our students deserve. This emergency regulation is currently open for public comment through November 24, and we strongly encourage you to make your voice heard.
